

Red Light Cameras May Help Solve Double Murder

Red light traffic cameras may be doing more than catching speeding cars, they may help police solve a murder.

Investigators from Balcones Heights and San Antonio Police told News 4 the controversial red light traffic cameras picked up the last moments before a deadly shooting.

A late night chase and gun battle left 36-year-old Laura Guerra and 18-year-old Emilio Guerra dead. Now police want to know if some red light cameras in Balcones Heights can help lead them to suspects from that January 2nd shooting.



Police said red light cameras caught two cars chasing the victims through Balcones Heights. Those cameras first caught the cars making a right turn Hillcrest.

San Antonio Police have access to video from the red light cameras, but have not released the images. They say the footage shows a Silver Expedition chasing after the victims' Chevy Corsica. The last set of cameras caught those gunmen speeding past red light cameras at Hillcrest and Babcock.

Away from the red light cameras and further down Hillcrest is where the deadly chase ended. Police said 2 people in the Silver Expedition fired at least 50 bullets into the victims' car.

Police told News 4 they still have a lot more work to do to solve the case.
